

Practical information on using the collections at the Manuscripts Department

- Collections belonging to the Department of Manuscripts may only be used in the Manuscripts Deprartment's Reading Room.
- In order to access the Manuscript Reading Room an entry pass shall be issued at the University of Warsaw Library Information Desk on the basis of a valid library card.
- Manuscripts in poor condition that have been copied digitally are only available to read in the digital version in the Manuscript Reading Room.
- Manuscripts that have not been copied digitally are available to read without restrictions (to the extent that their state of preservation permits).
- Microfilms of the manuscripts are freely available in the Main Reading Room.
- Manuscripts may be photographed after obtaining the consent of the librarian on duty. It is forbidden to make other copies of manuscripts independently.

High-resolution scans and digital photos may be ordered via a special form available from the Manuscript Reading Room and the Reprographic Office, or via e-mail correspondence with the Orders Office: **reprobuw@uw.edu.pl**.

The collections are divided into three parts with separate unit numbers (important to note when ordering manuscripts):

- 1. catalogue reference numbers: Rps BUW no. (for manuscripts included in vol. 1–8 of the *Catalogue of Manuscripts of the University Library in Warsaw*);
- 2. inventory reference number: Rps BUW inventory no. (for manuscripts included in auxiliary files see below);

History of the collection

The library was established in 1817 when the University of Warsaw was founded. In 1818 it was transformed into the Public Library at the Royal University of Warsaw. After the closure of the University in 1834, it was renamed the Government Library. After a reorganisation of education in the Kingdom of Poland in 1840, it became the Library of the Warsaw Scientific District. As a result of reforms, it functioned from 1862 as the Main Library, at the same time serving the university that had been reactivated under the name of Main School. In 1871 it was handed over to the Imperial University of Warsaw under Russia rule, and after 1915 it became the library of the resurrected Polish university. During the Second World War, the German occupation authorities established the 1st Department of the German State Library (Staatsbibliothek Warschau Abteilung I) out of the University Library. Since 1945, it has functioned once more as the University Library.

The manuscript collections were created by combining three groups of manuscripts: a) from the collections of the Warsaw Lyceum Library; b) manuscripts collected at the Court of Appeal, partially transferred in 1817; c) manuscripts selected by the director SAMUEL BOGUMIŁ LINDE from collections of religious institutions that were suppressed at that time (monasteries, schools run by religious orders, monastery libraries, etc.). In addition, there were acquisitions from the 1820s: the archive of MARCELLO BACCIARELLI manuscripts from an exchange with the Library of the Provincial School in Kalisz and others. In 1830, the collection numbered about 2,000 items, including over 1,000 medieval codices. After the collapse of the November Uprising, at the behest of the tsarist authorities, the Library's collections were subjected to a detailed linguistic and political selection, and then most were transported to St. Petersburg. Only 303 manuscripts in Polish were left behind, to which 210 manuscripts were added after the confiscation of the collection of the Warsaw Society of Friends of

Sciences. Over the next thirty years, the collection grew insignificantly (the legacy of the orientalist ALOJZY LUDWIK CHIARINI, several manuscripts from the liquidated Application School, etc.). A revival took place in the 1860s, when the Main School in Warsaw was in operation. At that time, a dozen or so valuable medieval codices were purchased, including from the collection of law historian FRIEDRICH LUDWIG KELLER; over 100 manuscripts were also delivered from the library at the Warsaw Departments of the Ruling Senate (the so-called Senate Library), which – before the judicial autonomy of the Kingdom of Poland was abolished - had existed as the Library of the Court of Appeal of the Kingdom of Poland and used to hold, inter alia, manuscripts from the private collections of the Minister of Justice FELIKS ŁUBIEŃSKI. In the 1860s, manuscripts were received from the monasteries in Warsaw dissolved after the January Uprising - Capuchin, Augustinian and Carmelite - as well as the legacy of mathematician and historian of science ADRIAN KRZYŻANOWSKI, law historian JÓZEF JAROSZEWICZ. At the moment when the Main Library was taken over by the Imperial University of Warsaw, the collection of manuscripts amounted to approximately 740, and to approximately 1380 in 1915. The acquisitions of this forty-year period included gifts from censure, from university authorities and professors, along with a small number of random antique purchases. Additionally, in the 1890s, twenty manuscripts were received together with the book collection of the Polish Bank. During the First World War, in 1915, the collection, then numbering around 1,380 units, was evacuated to Rostov-on-Don. During its recovery in the 1920s, the Library regained the collections with minor defects, while the manuscripts of the Public Library at the Royal University - removed after the November Uprising, along with other recovered manuscripts from the former Załuski Library, Society of Friends of Sciences and others - were temporarily deposited with the University Library and then transferred along with the entire collection from St. Petersburg to the National Library in 1930-1931 and 1936.

In 1939, the collection consisted of 4,132 manuscripts, including 1,843 items categorised as 'miscellaneous manuscripts', including individual letters, documents and dossiers from different times and different origins. During the Second World War, manuscripts from the University, National and Krasiński Library were gathered in the special collections department (Abteilung III Sondersammlungen) of the German-created Staatsbibliothek Warschau in the building of the Krasiński Library at 9 Okólnik Street. On the eve of the outbreak of the war a chest containing, among others, some valuable manuscripts was hidden in the basement of the building of the University Library. Luckily, the box survived, whereas the manuscripts in Okólnik were set on fire after the Warsaw Uprising and completely destroyed (cf. *List of destroyed University of Warsaw Library manuscripts*. In: H. Kozerska: *Straty...*, cf. bibliography below). The foundation of the post-war collection was the rescued fragment of the former resource (262 items) and two large collections given to the Library in 1945: from the Warsaw Scientific Society and the Evangelical Reformed Parish in Warsaw. Since the end of the war, the collection has grown steadily through purchases and donations.

Part II Collections

The catalogue is divided into two parts. The first one, entitled **Libraries and Historical Collec-tions**, describes the old collections and libraries in alphabetical order and provides an overview of their contents. Information is provided about the collection founder, the collection profile and its most valuable items.

The second part is divided into two smaller sections: **Materials of Institutions and Associations** with a description of contents and the **Individual and Family Legacies**, containing materials documenting their life, work and activity.

1. Libraries and Historical Collections

CAROLATH-BEUTHEN princes, Carolath (Siedlisko) in Silesia

Carolath–Beuthen, a German principality in the former Prussian district of Legnica, belonged to the SCHONAICH family from the beginning of 17th century. Their residence in Carolath on the Oder, housed a rich archive as well as library collections. The collections were secured and transported to the University of Warsaw Library in 1945. These are fragments of the Majorat Library, the prince's private library and the domestic archive (16th–19th century). The manuscripts contain legal, religious, philosophical texts, as well as mathematics textbooks. There are also fragments of the library catalogues of the Carolath collection and fragments of local archives, letters written to Princess von Carolath, and school and university notes from various fields, kept by representatives of the family. In addition, literary works, texts on military matters, and property management (in terms of agriculture, breeding, horticulture, fishing, hunting) have been preserved. The secured collection also includes an 18th–century herbarium.

Court of Appeal (collections later referred to as the Senate Library)

A library founded in 1810 by the Minister of Justice FELIKS ŁUBIEŃSKI from the so-called 'savings fund' of the Court of Appeal. Several private book collections and many manuscripts from monasteries, mainly in Greater Poland, were gathered by means of exchange or donations (see below, Monastery Libraries). Most of these collections were incorporated into the Public Library at the University of Warsaw in 1817. The part containing the ŁUBIEŃSKI collections from Kalinowa and Guzów (the manuscripts of FELIKS's great uncle, primate WŁADYSŁAW ŁUBIEŃSKI, father-in-law of FRANCISZK BIELIŃSKI, fragments of the legacy of Jan Chrzciciel Albertrandi with the archives of Stanisław August) were not handed over to the Library until 1865 by the Warsaw Departments of the Ruling Senate that took over the library after the Court of Appeal of the Kingdom of Poland had been abolished in 1841, henceforth known as the Senate library. It has survived and the University of Warsaw Library holds approximately 30 items, including the legacy of WŁADYSŁAW ŁUBIEŃSKI (see legacy), a fragment of the archive of STANISŁAW AUGUST, papers and correspondence in church matters, the correspondence of Fr. GAETANO GHIGIOTTI, Knight of Malta and Registrar of the Royal Cabinet.

DICKSTEIN SAMUEL (1851–1939)

S. Dickstein was a mathematician and historian of science. His collection includes manuscripts in the fields of mathematics and technology, as well as the legacy of, among others, AUGUSTYN FRĄCZK-IEWICZ (see legacy), FELIKS KUCHARZEWSKI (see legacy), and JAN SLESZYŃSKI (see legacy). Collections deposited at the Warsaw Scientific Society (see below) after the First World War by DICKSTEIN along with his own legacy (see legacy).

Evangelical-Augsburg Church of St. Catherine in Gdańsk

Manuscripts from the 15th–19th centuries, including the legacy of Pastor ERNEST BLECH (see legacy), containing prayer books from the 15th–16th centuries, catechisms, collections of sermons from Gdańsk clergymen, legal texts (Chełmno law, Prussian national law from the 17th century), materials regarding the history of Gdańsk (especially church institutions), literary texts, notes from E. Blech's university studies and, additionally, albums from the 18th and 19th centuries, collections of literary texts, materials related to Anna Maria Neander's charity work, and accounting ledgers of Gdańsk enterprises. The manuscripts were kept safe in Sobowidz near Gdańsk and transported to the University of Warsaw Library in 1945.

Evangelical Reformed Church in Warsaw

Manuscripts from this collection were given to the University of Warsaw Library by the authorities of the Evangelical Reformed Church in 1945. In the period that ran from the beginning of the 20th century until 1939, they were kept at the Evangelical Reformed Synod in Warsaw. They include fragments of the archives of the former Evangelical Reformed Unity of Małopolska (16th–19th century); archives of KAROL DIEHL who was the Senior General of Evangelical Reformed Churches and the President of the Evangelical Reformed Consistory in the Duchy of Warsaw and the Kingdom of Poland containing materials from the end of the 18th century until 1831 (see legacy); dossiers of

the Evangelical Reformed Church in Warsaw (18th–19th centuries) and some congregations from the territory of the Kingdom of Poland (20th century); various manuscripts from the Library of the Evangelical Reformed Church in Warsaw; fragments of the legacies of clergy and followers, including ALEKSANDER WOYDE (see legacy) and JÓZEF SPLESZYŃSKI (see legacy).

FEDEROWSKI MICHAŁ (1853–1923)

M. Federowski was a researcher of Belarusian folklore. His collections mainly include legal and property dossiers of noble estates from Western Belarus and Lithuania (16th–19th century). They also contain loose documents from various areas of Poland. The collections were transferred to the Warsaw Scientific Society (see below) by FEDEROWSKI according to his last will along with a large part of the legacy (see legacy). Part of FEDEROWSKI's collection (including materials on other ethnographers: Zygmunt Gloger, Oskar Kolberg), was found after 1945 in the Polish Folklore Society in Wrocław and the Archives of the Polish Academy of Sciences in Warsaw.

GOCEL LUDWIK (1889–1996)

L. Gocel was a historian and bibliophile; after the Second World War, he dealt with so-called secured collections. His collection includes materials on the history of Krakow and Galicia in the 19th century as well as leaflets from the Revolutions of 1848.

JABŁONOWSKI ALEKSANDER (1829–1913)

A. Jabłonowski was a historian and ethnographer. His collection includes copies and correspondence in public matters from the times of the interregnum after JOHN III SOBIESKI and AUGUST II, source materials regarding the history of Podlasie, sejmik dossiers and other documents from the 16th–18th centuries and, additionally, a fragment of ADOLF PAWIŃSKI's workshop materials. KELLER FRIEDRICH LUDWIG (1799-1860)

F.L. Keller was professor of Roman law at the Universities of Zurich, Halle and Berlin. In 1862, his collection was auctioned. The library then acquired several valuable medieval codices from this collections. Currently, 4 are held at the University of Warsaw Library, including Breviarium Alarici and Lex Salica from the 9th century and Institutiones Iustiniani from the 11th–12th century; both originated from the Jesuit College in Clairmont, near Paris.

The KUROPATNICKIs

A library created in Tarnowiec and Lipinki (Gorlice district) by EWARYST ANDRZEJ KUROPATNICKI (1734–1788), castellan of Belz, and by his son JÓZEF (1766–1832), who, in accordance with his father's will, made donations to several libraries, including Society of the Friends of Sciences (see below). Currently, the University of Warsaw Library has 5 manuscripts from the 16th and 18th centuries with bookplates by JÓZEF KUROPATNICKI, including the Second Lithuanian Statute.

Landes-Bibliothek, Darmstadt (State Library Darmstadt)

A library in the castle of the Hesse-Homburg Landgraves, built in 1680–1685 at the request of Prince Frederick II. In the years 1804–1805 the librarian was Friedrich Hölderlin. After the death of the last Landgrave Ferdinand in 1866, the library was inherited by Ludwig III, Grand Duke of Hesse-Darmstadt (only a few books remained at the Homburg castle). After 1918, the collection, along with other private books belonging to Grand Duke Ernst Ludwig, was purchased for the Landes-Bibliothek in Darmstadt (formerly known as Grossherzogliche Cabinettsbibliothek), where it burned down almost entirely in 1944.

Most of the manuscripts found at the University of Warsaw Library are materials regarding military history in the 18th and 19th centuries, mainly in Hesse: numerous rank tables, military regulations, drill manuals. Single manuscripts exist referring to the Austrian, Russian and Dutch armies.

The remaining Darmstadt manuscripts are extremely diverse in content. They originate from the 18th–20th centuries and contain literary works, a selection of speeches by the patriarch of Moscow Filaret from 1841 (translated into German), and memoirs from a trip to Italy and Africa. There are also scripts for university lectures from Wrocław from the 19th century.

The LUBOMIRSKIs from Mała Wieś (in the Grójec district).

In the mid-18th century, Mała Wieś belonged to BAZYLI WALICKI, the castellan of Sochaczew, who also owned Mogielnica, bought from the Cistercian monastery in Sulejów. It became the property of the LUBOMIRSKI family only in the second half of the 19th century (after the WICHLIŃSKIs and ZAMOYSKIs). The family archive and collections are located in the Central Archives of Historical Records in Warsaw, and some in the National Library. The University of Warsaw Library collections include documents and files regarding Mogielnica, including grants of the Dukes of Mazovia from the 13th and 14th centuries to the Cistercian monastery in Sulejów. Purchased in 1949.

Monastery libraries

Larger batches of manuscripts from former monastery libraries were received by the Library three times: a) in 1817, together with the Court of Appeal book collection (see above); b) in the years 1818–1829, brought by director SAMUEL BOGUMIŁ LINDE from monasteries in the Kingdom of Poland; c) after the dissolution of some Warsaw monasteries after the January Uprising (the library obtained approximately 150 codices at that time).

More than 30 manuscripts (15th–19th century) were saved and are now stored at the University of Warsaw Library. They came from the following monasteries: the Augustinians, Carmelites and Capuchins in Warsaw, the Benedictines in Święty Krzyż, the Cistercians in Oliwa and Wąchock, the Canons Regular in Czerwińsk and Trzemeszno, the Canons Regular of the Lateran in Mstów and the Collegiate Church in Sandomierz.

PESZKE JÓZEF (1845–1916)

J. Peszke was a doctor and a member of the Warsaw Medical Society. Polish Bank

The Polish Bank Library was established in 1828. Its main protector was one of the bank directors, HENRYK ŁUBIEŃSKI. With his resignation in 1842, the library began to fall into disrepair. In 1879, after the prints and manuscripts had been prepared by HIPOLIT SKIMBOROWICZ, they were put up for auction, which was cancelled due to opposition from the press. The library was reorganised, with part of the collection being transferred to other institutions. At the end of 1885, the Polish Bank was liquidated and the library – along with the remaining manuscript collections – was taken over by the Warsaw Branch of the Russian State Bank. In 1899, they were handed over to the University of Warsaw Library. According to SKIMBOROWICZ's inventory, there were 27 manuscripts at the time and 15 items were saved.

Prussian State Library in Berlin (Preußische Staatsbibliothek zu Berlin)

A dozen or so manuscripts from this library were transferred to the University of Warsaw Library in 1946 together with collections secured from Jelenia Góra. They include workshop materials of the German orientalist Friedrich Rückert, a dictionary of the Tungusian language developed by linguist Paul Georg von Möllendorff, excerpts from Terentian's plays, a genealogical table of the Lemke family, a facsimile of manuscripts of Westphalian poets, extracts from legal texts and a text on Germanic mythology.

Royal Warsaw Society of the Friends of Sciences

The Society of Friends of Sciences was established in 1800. From 1807 it operated under the name of the Royal Society of Friends of Sciences. The library, housing a rich collection of prints and manuscripts, was opened to the general public in 1811. After the collapse of the November Uprising, it shared the fate of the Public Library at the University of Warsaw under a tsar's decree. The collections underwent selection and most of it was taken to St. Petersburg. The rest, including 179 manuscripts, were incorporated into the equally truncated collection of the Public Library. Their further fate is connected with the history of the University Library and the National Library. Currently, the University of Warsaw Library houses, among others, manuscripts of IGNACY KRASICKI's works handed over to the Society by FRANCISZEK SALEZY DMOCHOWSKI (see legacy), a manuscript of Sofiówka by STANISŁAW TREMBECKI, remains of the SAPIEHA collections from Kodeń and of the KUROPATNICKIs (see above).

The SAPIEHAs from Kodeń

The collections made from the first half of the 18th century by JAN FRYDERYK SAPIEHA (1680–1751), chancellor, expanded by the book collection of his wife, KONSTANCJA née RADZIWIŁŁ. They were inherited and further developed by his great-grandson KAZIMIERZ NESTOR SAPIEHA (1750–1797), General of the Lithuanian Artillery. In the early 19th century, Kazimierz's cousin, ALEKSANDER SA-PIEHA (1773–1812) donated these collections to the Society of the Friends of Sciences in Warsaw (see below). Currently, the University of Warsaw Library has several manuscripts from the 16th and 17th centuries, including historical and literary miscellanea, correspondence from the pre-partition period, and 1 manuscript from the 17th century: Historia o chwalebnym Zmartwychwstaniu [The story of the glorious resurrection] by MIKOŁAJ Z WILKOWIECKA (with the bookplate of the library of JAN FRYDERYK SAPIEHA in Kodeń).

The STRAWINSKIs from Nakryszki

The collection was probably gathered from the 18th century by members of the STRAWIŃSKI family at the Nakryszki estate (former Słonim district). The collection (18th–19th centuries) mainly includes miscellanea, copies of stage and literary works, textbooks and school notes; many of them belonging to FLORIAN BRUNON STRAWIŃSKI, mayor of Słonim (died 1787). In addition, excerpts from financial dossiers on Nakryszki, Mirowszczyzna, Sirotowszczyzna properties and others. After the First World War, the STRAWIŃSKIs collections were transferred to the Warsaw Scientific Society (see below), donated by the family.

Voivodeship School in Kalisz

In 1827, headmaster S.B. LINDE ran an exchange between the Public Library of the University of Warsaw and the Library of the Kalisz School. At that time he received some prints and a handful of manuscripts. 4 items have survived, including a copy of historical materials from the 17th century to the reigns of ZYGMUNT III, WŁADYSŁAW IV and JAN KAZIMIERZ.

Wallenberg-Fenderlinsche Bibliothek zu Landeshut (Library at the Evangelical and Augsburg Church of the Holy Trinity in Kamienna Góra in Silesia)

The library was founded in 1727 by MELCHIOR DUCIUS VON WALLENBERG from his legate for the church in Kamienna Góra, and in 1824 it was expanded with the book collection and funding from lawyer LUKAS FENDERLIN, hence the name Wallenberg-Fenderlinsche Bibliothek. The library was managed by curators (representatives of the church board and city board). Some of the manuscripts in this collection were received by the University of Warsaw Library in 1945. These are manuscripts from the 17th and 19th centuries mainly concerning Kamienna Góra, the city system and the organisation of the local church (including ordinances regarding church matters issued by Silesian rulers, reports from the renovation of the church in Kamienna Góra in the 18th century, church ledgers of the Kamienna Góra parish). The catalogues of the collection in Kamienna Góra are also preserved, as well as letters written by Fryderyk II to General F.W. Seydlitz, as well as 7 doctoral diplomas awarded at the Frederick-Alexander University in Erlangen.

Warsaw Lyceum

The lyceum was founded in 1804 by the Prussian authorities; transformed after the collapse of the November Uprising into the Voivodeship Gymnasium and then the Guberniyal Gymnasium. In 1817, the Lyceum Library became part of the emerging Public Library at the University of Warsaw. Only 2 items have survived from its manuscript collections.

This catalogue of collections was drafted largely thanks to a text by Joanna Borysiak included in volume 1 of the publication *Manuscript Collections in Libraries and Museums in Poland*, compiled by D. Kamolowa with the assistance of T. Sieniatecka, Warsaw 2003. Extensions and updates were mainly performed on part II of the collections.
